## The Essentials

	Sheets – regular Twin size
	Blanket
	Pillow
	Comforter – regular Twin size
	Casual Clothing – For classes and regular day activities Example: Clean/ neat jeans and sweatpants without stains or tears or writing/graphics in inappropriate locations, modest tops
	Nice Dress wear/Clothing – For church, special campus events and conferences, and Tuesday President's Chapel Ladies – Knee length Dresses and skirts, dress pants and modest blouses, and dress shoes Guys – Button-up and/or Collared shirts, dress shoes, and slacks/ khakis dress pants (ties are optional)
	Laundry bag or basket, laundry soap and quarters
	Hangers
	Alarm clock
	Towel(s) and a robe or cover up
	Personal hygiene products – shampoo, body wash, deodorant, etc.
	Desk calendar or planner
	Trash can
	Small fan
	Winter coat
	Facial Tissues and Hand Sanitizer

## Basic Supplies

	Pens, Pencils, and Highlighters
	Notebooks and/or Lined Loose-Leaf paper
	Bible
	Power Strips – MUST have a circuit breaker due to fire code safety instructions
	Foam Mattress Topper – Optional, but nice to have
	Desk Lamp or Floor Lamp
	Mini Fridge
	Message Board for your door and magnets – Doors are metal, and the boards help with dorm communication
	Laptop computer and USB Flash Drive
	Cell Phone
	Plastic or Disposable Cups, Bowls, Plates, and Utensils
	Removable Wall Hooks and Poster Strips
	Earplugs – If you are a light sleeper or like to go to bed early
	Shower Shoes or Flip-Flops
	Extra Batteries
	Snacks to keep in your room
	Plastic Storage Container - to keep snacks sealed off and to prevent the attraction of bugs

## What NOT to Bring

Pets
Weapons of any kind
Microwaves, Toasters, or Hot Plates – Due to Fire Code Safety Regulations
Candles or Incense
Air Conditioners
Nails, Double-Sided tape, thumb tacks, or Non-Removable Wall Hooks
Large Amounts of cash – There are several local banks where you can open an account
Valuables – If you must bring valuable items with you, community living means that it is always wise to purchase a lock box to store them in. Also, take this precaution if you have prescription medication(s).
Large Furniture Items – Unless approved in advance by the Student Life Coordinator
Second-Hand Furniture of any kind
Alcohol, Cigarettes, and/or Illegal Drugs – Davis College is a Dry, Smoke and Drug-Free Campus
Immodest Clothing – Please contact the Student Life Coordinator or consult the Student Handbook (available for viewing at <a href="http://my.davisny.edu">my.davisny.edu</a> ) with any questions about what attire is and is not appropriate under the Davis College standards
